1. JURISDICTION

This is a Competitor Coaching Day run by the MG Classic Racing Register and the MG Car Club.

The Meeting will be held under these Supplementary Regulations, the MotorSport NZ National Sporting Code and its Appendices and Schedules particularly Appendix Five, Schedule C being the Standing Regulations for all ClubSport Events and Appendix Two, Schedule A – Driver and Vehicle Safety Requirements.

The MotorSport NZ Permit Number is 240535.

The venue is the Manfeild: Circuit Chris Amon, Feilding.

4. ENTRIES AND FEES

Please enter electronically via https://online.motorsport.org.nz/msnzprofile/login and download the "MotorSport New Zealand" app onto your phone.

If you do not have a current Motorsport Online log in, create one at https://online.motorsport.org.nz/msnzprofile/login by selecting "Register Here" and complete the details.

To enter the Event

Tap the Profile button

If your vehicle does not have a logbook – Select Vehicles and Add/Find the vehicle using the chassis number.

Then, select Events

Go to January 2025 and in the field for the 20th January - tap on "2025 MGCRR Competitor Coaching Day" Tap the Enter button - fill in all the details required. Then Submit.

Entry Fee is \$100 for club members of the MGCC and MGCRR paid by internet banking prior to the day, \$120 for all others who enter paid by internet banking prior to the day. All entries on the day \$120 to be paid by cash. The charge is per driver and passengers are free. Please make payment by 19th January to: MG Car Club, Bank acc Account # 030525 0217704 00. Please use your name and "20 January" as a reference. Please also email the secretary to confirm payment has been made.

No MSNZ licence or NZ drivers licence required, but Tutors must either hold a current MSNZ competition licence or have held a MSNZ competition licence previously.

Requisite helmet and overalls are required as per below.

Passengers as per requirements below.

One car can be shared between two or more drivers.

6. NUMBER OF STARTERS

The maximum number of starters will be 50 at the discretion of the Clerk of Course on the day. Any additional entries will be placed on the reserve list in order of receipt. Safety at all times will be top priority. The organisers reserve the right to cancel the event if less than 25 entries have been received by 18 January 2025.

7. PASSENGERS

Passengers will be permitted to travel only in specified runs at the Clerk of the Course's discretion and in accordance with Appendix Five, Schedule C, Part One, Article 6. All passengers must sign a Motorsport indemnity form. Drivers are required to ensure all passengers wear appropriate safety apparel as specified in the competitor's safety regulations contained in Appendix Two Schedule A.

9. DOCUMENTATION, AUDITING & DRIVERS BRIEFING

Documentation and auditing will be at the Manfeild circuit on the day. Drivers, Instructors and Passengers must complete the indemnity form. All drivers must attend the driver's briefing held at the circuit at the start of the day.

Drivers and passengers will be provided with a wristband confirming they have completed documentation. No driver or passenger will be allowed to take part without having the appropriate identification

10. PERSONAL SAFETY

All crew members (driver and passenger) shall wear protective clothing consisting of overalls, underwear, socks and shoes as detailed in Appendix Two Schedule A Part One 4.3(1) and 4.3(2). As an example 100% cotton garments are accepted. Helmets are required as per Appendix Two, Schedule A 4.1(1) for all occupants. Any questions ring Ron Robertson 0274 439 969

Helmets as per Groups below. If you have them, wear them. There will be some available to borrow.

11. FIRST AID & FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

A trained person will be in attendance for First Aid and Emergency 111 will be used if necessary. A Fire Extinguisher will be at the Start Line with a rescue vehicle. Additional Fire Extinguishers will be situated at selected points around the track. Flag marshals may be used if manning levels permit. They will be briefed and in contact with the Clerk of Course by radio at all times. Start/Finish will control the Flags.

13. PROVISIONAL ITINERARY

The day's sessions will be adjusted according to weather conditions and drivers requests. Times shown are a guide only.

8.30 am Sign in - Motorsport indemnity forms for drivers and passengers. Drivers not currently a member of a Motorsport Affiliated Club will be given day membership of the MG Classic

Racing Register unless this is their first event. This is included in the entry fee.

9.00 am Drivers briefing for drivers taking part in formal instruction session.

9.15 am- 11am Formal instruction sessions take place. Three instructor led exercises with be held on

track for drivers to rotate through (ie braking, corner apexes and a slalom), followed by a slow tutorial series of laps of the track. Slow speeds 50kph to 70kph to show corner entry

and exit braking points. Helmets not required. No passing on corners passing on

straights only.

Helmets are required except for the SLOW TUTORIAL SESSION where Tuition is being undertaken. When tuition is being undertaken, no cars are to break traction or drive in an unsafe manner.

Group 1 will be controlled to approximately road speed, passengers allowed for the purpose of driver tuition. No passing in corners. Passing of slower cars on straights must be done safely and with consideration of new drivers and no excessive speed on straights,
 Group 2, faster speeds, fewer restrictions, Passengers only in approved cars allowed by the Clerk of the Course. Helmets and Overalls required in all cars. A minimum of fire retardant cotton work overalls. Overalls must be clean and complete.
 Group 3 faster speeds, fewer restrictions, Passengers only in approved cars allowed by

the Clerk of the Course and require full safety gear (helmets and overalls) including roll protection. A minimum of fire retardant cotton work overalls. Overalls must be clean and

1:00pm (tbc) Driver's Briefing for anyone who did not attend the morning Driver's Briefing. This is to enable drivers with cars more suited to the faster sessions to skip the morning session should they wish.

1:00 pm approx Group 1

2:00 pm approx Group 3

Then repeat Groups round again till about 4.30 or when we run out of vehicles.
